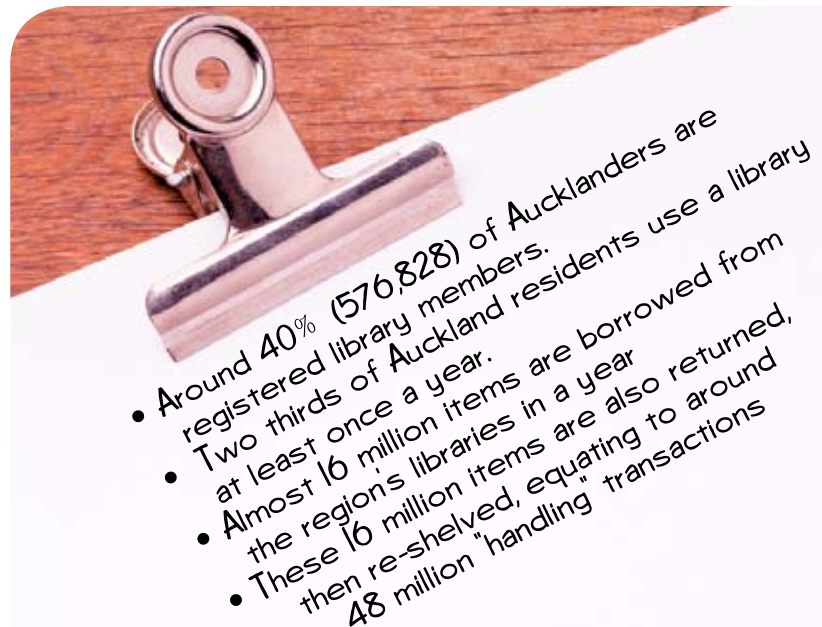
Stage one of our move to Auckland Council has been completed. We are using the same computer system for library management as all the other Auckland libraries, we have extended the standard loan and renewal periods and made changes to our charges.

Stage two will take place when the Auckland Council comes into being on November 1st. At this time the seven different council libraries from Rodney to Franklin will merge into one organisation. This amalgamation of libraries will be the largest group in Australasia, giving Aucklanders access to

around 3.5 million items, including CDs, DVDs, language collections and audio books as well as on-line information and databases.

Aucklanders will be able to use the resources, facilities and programmes offered at any library they choose. Members will be able to use the library that is most convenient for them, where they live, where they work or where they shop and they will be able to reserve items in any of the libraries free of charge.

Current Franklin ratepayers who are library members and live in areas that will become part of Waikato District from 1st November, will still be able to use their bookinopolis/Franklin libraries card at any of the Auckland Libraries to borrow items. From 1st November any Waikato resident who does not hold a valid bookinopolis/Franklin libraries individual membership will still be able to join the Auckland Libraries by paying a subscription – If you join the Franklin Libraries before 1st November membership will be free.

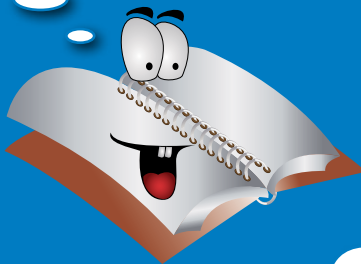

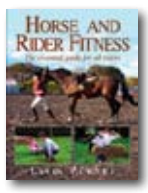
